Keen competitors vie for top honours in conformation, showmanship and education at EastGen's first show of the season

STRATFORD, ONTARIO –176 participants descended upon the fairgrounds in Stratford, Ontario from July 2nd to 3rd for two days of education, skill enhancement, fun and friendly competition at the 2015 EastGen Challenge West. This was the first youth event for 2015 in a series of four organized by EastGen across their service area, and drew the largest number of competitors.

"As staff, one of the highlights of our year is to work with the next generation who are so enthusiastic, energetic and passionate about the dairy business," said Brian O'Connor, EastGen general manager. The two-day event drew participants between 14 and 21 years of age, from across the western Ontario region. Andrew's topic of social media and agriculture advocacy was a highlight for participants who have been following his #farm365 campaign on Twitter this year. Participants spent the afternoon at Walnutlawn Farms in Tavistock, Ontario. While touring and learning from the Zehr family, 4-H'ers also had the opportunity to learn from EastGen's Jim Biggar and Stephanie Murphy from Grand Valley Fortifiers. A quiz followed the education portion, which contributes to final scores for the overall grand champion award.

The participants then put their skills to the test on show day under the appraisal of judge Jeff Stephens of Troy, Ontario.
