Beef Producer Brings High-Tech Monitoring to the Pasture

Will and Nancy Briscoe operate a 160-acre beef cow/calf operation overlooking the Bonnechere River Valley near Renfrew, ON. While beef producers aren't always early adopters of herd monitoring technology, this couple is proving that innovation doesn't belong solely to the dairy industry.

Coming from agricultural backgrounds—Will from a mixed farm in Renfrew and Nancy from a beef and cream-producing farm at Winchester—they've carried forward generations of passion and care for cattle. Their current herd continues a family tradition of raising beef cattle on their farm since 1981.
