TODD HOLM HOLMDALE FARMS LIMITED ELMWOOD, ON

Holmdale Farms is a family operation spanning 1,500 acres, milking 180 Holsteins in a modern, compost-bedded pack barn equipped with four milking robots. The herd averages 40 litres of milk per day, with 4.55% fat and 3.5% protein. Official milk recording and type classification are key tools in tracking progress and maintaining high performance.

A major focus at Holmdale is strategic investment aimed at long-term herd improvement and profitability. 2025 marked the addition of two new facilities for animals under 12 months of age aiming to increase health, space and growth to bolster first lactation performance. By incorporating Semex embryos, the Holmdale team has built a genetics program targeting gains in Lifetime Production Index (LPI) and Robot Ready™ traits, while maintaining a strong emphasis on conformation. The farm's top-performing calves are flushed with sexed semen, resulting in impressive outcomes.

Holmdale Holsteins maintains a strong partnership with Semex and EastGen, fully utilizing programs such as Elevate® genomic testing, OptiMate™ breeding tools, E&P benchmarking, and personalized consultative services. Looking to the future, Holmdale's goal is to achieve quota with fewer cows by focusing on high-performing, low-maintenance animals.

"We're aiming for cows that produce milk efficiently, with high fat content, and require less management," Todd says.
